The following will be the information related to this investigator by MR. ROBERTSON.

MR. ROBERTSON state that he First met a black male identified as TOMMY MADISON in January of 1988. ROBERTSON said that the only thing that TOMMY MADISON said about the killings was that he (MADISON) and GARY PULLIAM had tried to assist the Medics in getting the body. ROBERTSON said that MADISON said that he told them that he was the Fire Chief with the Alexander Fire Department. ROBERTSON did state that MADISON stated that he was worried that the police thought that he was involved.

ROBERTSON stated that he was introduced to TOMMY MADISON by his girlfriend, a black female identified as MARILYN PETERS, 26 years of age, who lives in Alexander, Arkansas, phone number 455-1142. ROBERTSON stated that he had been going with MARILYN PETERS from October or November of 1987 until March of 1988.

ROBERTSON stated that during the time that he was going with MARILYN PETERS, that he started purchasing cocaine from TOMMY MADISON for MARILYN PETERS. ROBERTSON stated that he purchased cocaine several times and that he stopped purchasing about three weeks ago. MADISON stated that he spent approximately \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00 on cocaine that he had purchased from TOMMY MADISON.

ROBERTSON stated that he purchased cocaine nearly every weekend and sometimes during the week from MADISON from a time period of January of 1988 through March of 1988, totalling approximately 10 to 12 times.

ROBERTSON stated that there was a black guy named J. D., who is about 6'2" to 6'3", 190 to 200 pounds, that was supposed to pe from Chicago that could be part of the cocaine connection.
