I knew who DON HENRY and KEVIN IVES were, but I was not very well acquainted with them. I am older than they were and I did not run around with them. My younger, KEITH CONEY, knew them. I think he is the same age they were.

I have heard rumors that they were going to rip off a cocaine deal, but I don't think so. I believe it was an accident. I have a brother, RONNIE ELAM, who was adopted by my grandparents that was struck by a train about two years ago at Mabelvale. He said he thought the train was on the other tracks and it slipped up on him. He was hurt, but not very bad.

INVESTIGATOR'S NOTES

On Friday, 4-8-88, this investigator received information from a confidential informant that a subject by the name of PAUL JACKSON had knowledge of the death of the two individuals on the railroad tracks in Saline County.

This subject, JACKSON, is described as a white male, 15 years of age, who is a resident at the Bridgeway Center in Maumelle, Arkansas. This subject was sent to the Bridgeway Center for chemical dependence relating to Crystal Methamphetamine.

The informant furnished information to this investigator that the JACKSON subject knew of two subjects in the Alexander, Arkansas area, who owned a video store. According to the informant, JACKSON had witnessed one of the subject pointing a gun at one of the dead subject's head the night before they were found on the railroad tracks. The informant stated, JACKSON had overheard one of the subject, in the video store saying that one of the dead subject, owed them on a drug dealing and would have to pay for his actions.

On this date this investigator relayed the above information to SGT. BARNEY PHILLIPS.

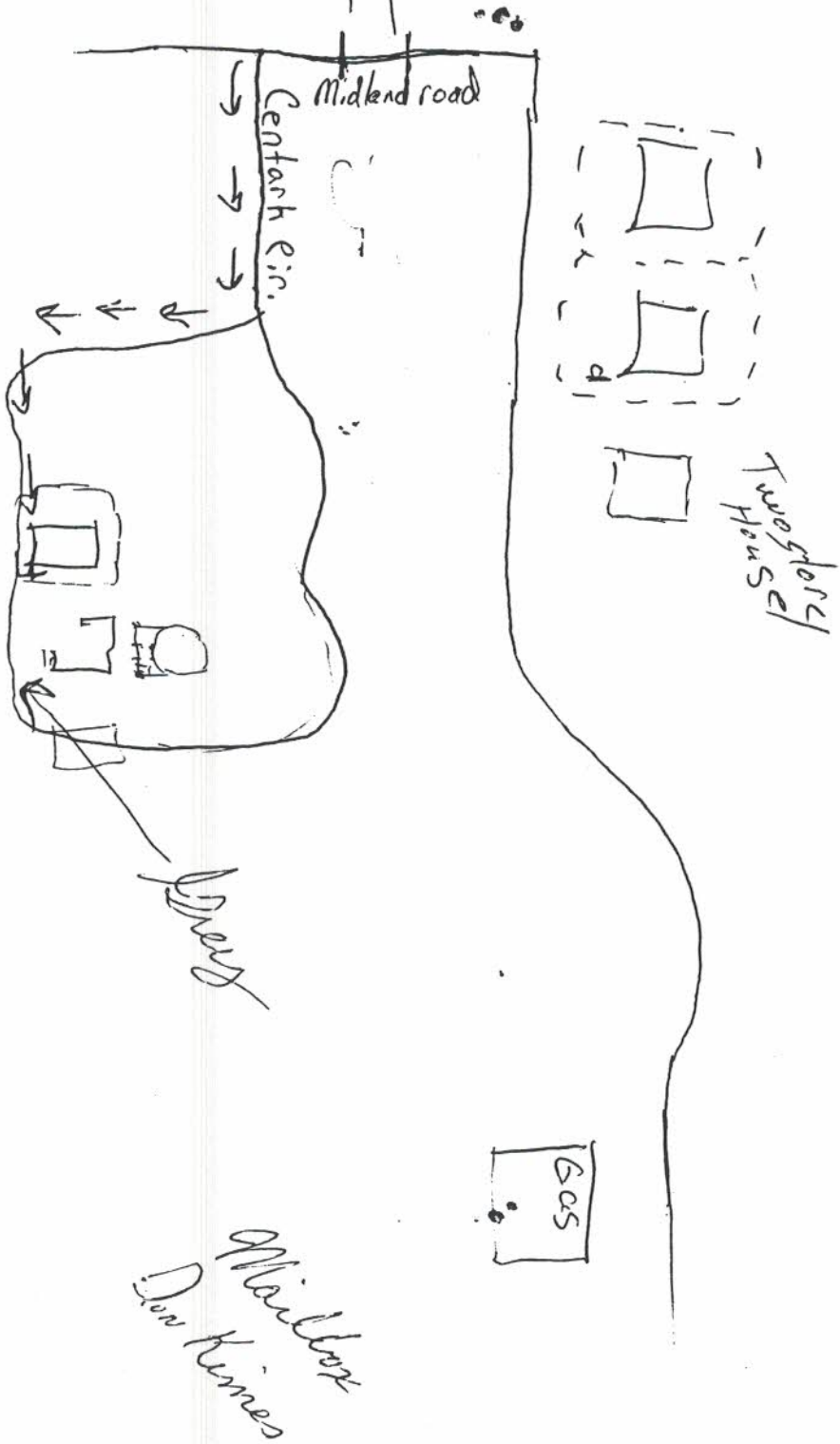

INVESTIGATOR'S NOTES

On 4-19-88, this investigator met with MR. BOB MONROE, the Claims Manager for the Union Pacific Railroad Company in North Little Rock, Arkansas at the Union Pacific Railroad in North Little Rock.

After meeting with MR. MONROE, he took me to an area of the railroad lot in North Little Rock, where Union Pacific engine number 4275 was parked. This investigator visually checked the Union Pacific locomotive unit number 4275, to see if I could identify any sharpened areas that would make a wound that would appear to be a knife wound. Due to the fact that I was unable to get completely under the unit, I was not able to check everything under the engine, but the portions of the engine that I was able to observe, I was unable to observe anything that matched that description. I was able to locate cotter pins on the engine that could possibly cause puncture wounds of some type, but nothing that could be verified concerning a specific wound.

While I was with MR. MONROE, we were able to set up a time to reconstruct the path of the train to the area of the incident. The time was set for the Thursday morning of 4-21-88, to be in the approximate time period that the incident occurred.

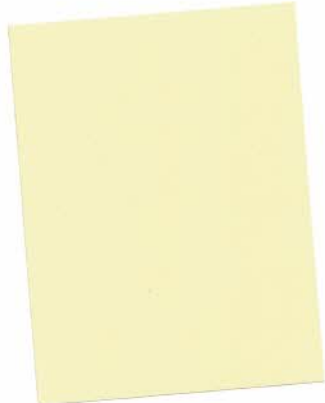

On 4-12-88, at approximately 11:05 a.m., DEPUTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY RICHARD GARRETT, ATTORNEY DAN HARMON, and this investigator interviewed RONNIE ROBERTSON at his residence in reference to information that he might have concerning the death of DON HENRY and LARRY KEVIN IVES.

The following will be the information related to this investigator by MR. ROBERTSON.

MR. ROBERTSON stated that he first met a black male identified as TOMMY MADISON in January of 1988. ROBERTSON said that the only thing that TOMMY MADISON said about the killings was that he (MADISON) and GARY PULLIAM had tried to assist the Medics in getting the body. ROBERTSON said that MADISON said that he told them that he was the Fire Chief with the Alexander Fire Department. ROBERTSON did state that MADISON stated that he was worried that the police thought that he was involved.

ROBERTSON stated that he was introduced to TOMMY MADISON by his girlfriend, a black female identified as MARILYN PETERS, 26 years of age, who lives in Alexander, Arkansas, phone number 455-1142. ROBERTSON stated that he had been going with MARILYN PETERS from October or November of 1987 until March of 1988.

ROBERTSON stated that during the time that he was going with MARILYN PETERS, that he started purchasing cocaine from TOMMY MADISON for MARILYN PETERS. ROBERTSON stated that he purchased cocaine several times and that he stopped purchasing about three weeks ago. MADISON stated that he spent approximately \$4,000.00 to \$5,000.00 on cocaine that he had purchased from TOMMY MADISON.

ROBERTSON stated that the most he had purchased at one time was approximately \$500.00. ROBERTSON stated that MADISON would sometimes use his (ROBERTSON's) truck to go get the cocaine and he would usually be gone approximately an hour and a half to two hours. ROBERTSON stated that he purchased cocaine nearly every weekend and sometimes during the week from MADISON from a time period of January of 1988 through March of 1988, totalling approximately 10 to 12 times.

ROBERTSON stated that there was a black guy named J. D., who is about 6'2" to 6'3", 190 to 200 pounds, that was supposed to be from Chicago that could be part of the cocaine connection. ROBERTSON stated that he met J. D. at TOMMY MADISON'S house while he was visiting his girlfriend who was at MADISON'S house. According to ROBERTSON, MADISON never stated exactly where he was purchasing the cocaine.

ROBERTSON stated that the last time he saw MARILYN was about three weeks ago and that was the last time that he saw TOMMY MADISON. ROBERTSON stated that at that time MADISON was talking about not having any transportation and that there was some heat on him and that his man who was furnishing him cocaine was shutting him off.

On 4-14-88, SGT. BARNEY PHILLIPS and this investigator interviewed TOMMY LEE MADISON in reference to information that he might have concerning the deaths of DON HENRY and LARRY IVES.

The following will be the information related to this investigator by MR. MADISON.

MADISON stated that his cousin, ALLEN SMITH and himself went to the scene of the train wreck where DON HENRY and LARRY IVES were killed. MADISON stated that he identified himself to the people at the scene as the Fire Chief for Alexander.

MADISON stated that he told one of the patrol officer at the scene that he knew a closer way to get to the scene. MADISON stated that there was a large crowd gathered attempting to find a closer way to the scene. MADISON stated that GARY PULLIAM and his cousin along with himself were with the crowd attempting to locate a closer way to get to the scene. "After I had told them that I thought I knew of a closer way to get closer to the scene, I got with the Ambulance Driver and took her to the area that was closer to the railroad track.

When we got to the area, she got out of the ambulance and I stayed with the ambulance and she went towards the railroad track. While she was gone, GARY PULLIAM and ALLEN SMITH came from the other cut-off, from the railroad tracks in a blue pickup, that belonged to GARY PULLIAM.

I talked to GARY and ALLEN to see if they had found a quicker way to get to the tracks and they said 'no'. About four to six minutes later, the ambulance driver came back and I released GARY and ALLEN when they drove off. I don't remember if the ambulance driver asked me about who they were or not. GARY and ALLEN were with us when we were first trying to figure out a closer way to get there, and the ambulance driver and the police officers were there in front of SONNY GATEWOOD's house.

I never went down to the scene. I never heard of any of these boys. I never said that if I got arrested that I wouldn't go to jail for something that someone else had done. I haven't heard anything about someone killing these boys."

- Q-B. Did you tell Garrett the complete truth?
- Ans. Yes.
- Q-C. Were you present before the two boys were struck by the train?
- Ans. No.

Q-F. Do you have personal knowledge of a marijuana patch in the area of the railroad tracks?

Ans. No.

Q-G. Did you know either of the two boys killed on the railroad tracks?

FINDINGS

The physiological responses noted on this subject's polygraph charts are in such a pattern as to indicate that the subject, Tommy Lee Madison, is essentially truthful in answering the above questions.
