On June 1, 1988, at 12:50 p.m., this investigator talked to Mr. JOHN SWOR, who is the Assistant Manager at the Safeway Store at Geyer Springs and Baseline Road in Little Rock, in reference to a KEVIN IVES, who had worked at that store prior to his death. Mr. SWOR stated to this investigator that KEVIN IVES had quit working at the store, due to being passed over during some promotions. He stated that KEVIN was a Courtesy Clerk and they had promoted some Courtesy Clerks to checkers, but they did not promote KEVIN because he was still in school and they needed someone that they could depend on to work anytime they needed them. When KEVIN was not promoted, he came in and told them he was quitting because he felt like he should have been promoted and it had hurt his feelings because he was passed over. Mr. SWOR further stated that KEVIN did a good job and they hated to lose him, but they needed checkers they could depend on.

On Wednesday, June 1, 1988, this investigator contacted MICHAEL LEE HARPER JR. telephonically at phone number 562-3222.

Mr. HARPER related the following:

"That on the last night that he saw KEVIN IVES and DON HENRY to the best of his recollection they were both wearing blue jeans, but he does not recall noticing the brand names. He said that he does not recall what type of footwear either of the boys were wearing. He said KEVIN IVES was wearing a pullover type shirt which had a collar, but he does not remember the color of the shirt. He said that he does not remember at all what type of shirt DON HENRY was wearing."

Mr. HARPER stated that he does not remember anything being in the vehicle except the flashlight and whiskey bottle that he previously mentioned. He said that, that night KEVIN IVES picked up the bottle but he put it back in the car and did not touch it again, according to his recollection.

Mr. HARPER stated that neither KEVIN IVES nor DON HENRY were wearing a hat that last night that he saw them and he did not see any hats in the vehicle they were driving. He stated that DON HENRY usually wore a camouflage baseball type hat but he stated that HENRY was not wearing one that night."

My assignment is to obtain records of any similiar incidents which may have occurred anywhere else in the nation within the last four years and to determine if there are any correlations between these cases and our case.

I was referred to your Agency by the N.T.S.B., who said you might possess this data and make it available to us. If you can be of assistance to us in our investigation, I would greatly appreciate it. I don't know how your data are broken down, but what we need is any information on accidents where individuals were struck by trains while laying on the tracks. Investigators Tom Craig and Dale Swesey have been assigned to the Arkansas State Police investigation of the deaths of Kevin Ives and Don Henry.

They have specific leads to follow concerning certain elements of the incident involving the Union Pacific Engine/Train.

We would certainly appreciate your assistance in helping our investigators obtain the following information:

1. The distance from the lit headlight on the train engine to the point of darkness or non-illumination (nighttime measurement).
2. Line of sight measurements from the train crew's vantage points.
3. Time lapse between the application of the emergency brake and the engine wheels locking and beginning to slide.
4. Decibel level of the train whistle at the distance from the last sounding to the point where the boys' bodies were first seen on the track. Decibel levels and frequency profiles of the train as it approaches the point where the bodies were first seen.

At approximately 2:20 p.m. on June 2, 1988, this investigator contacted Ms. DONNA STEWART by phone at her residence. The following will be the information related to this investigator by Ms. STEWART.

Ms. STEWART stated that she did go to the party on Alexander Mountain the night of the deaths of DON HENRY and KEVIN IVES. Ms. STEWART stated that she arrived at the party at approximately 11:00 p.m., and upon her arrival that DON and KEVIN were not at the party. Ms. STEWART stated that she knew both of the boys and had gone to school with them. Ms. STEWART stated that she did not remember who told her, but someone had told her that DON and KEVIN were at the party and got in a fight with a black male.

Ms. STEWART stated that she was moving from the residence noted in this interview but that she would call Ms. KAY ZUBER and advise her of her new phone number and address in case we needed to obtain more information.

At approximately 5:15 p.m. on June 2, 1988, Sergeant BARNEY PHILLIPS and this investigator interviewed Mr. & Mrs. LARRY IVES at their residence at #25 Hickory Drive in Benton, Arkansas. The following will be the information related to this investigator by the IVES.

Mr. & Mrs. IVES stated that they would like to see the following information followed-upon concerning the death of their son. Mr. IVES stated that GARY PULLIAM and ALLEN SMITH who were at the scene in a pickup truck the night of the incident needed to be interviewed concerning why they were at that location at that time of night.

Mrs. IVES stated that a JOHNNY EVANS who runs an arcade in Bryant is supposed to always wear a knife strapped to his leg and had made a statement that the night of the incident that when he left the arcade he did not go back to the arcade, but that there was information that he was supposed to have been at the arcade at approximately midnight in the back using cocaine with other people.

The IVES stated that a PAUL PETTS was supposed to have said that he had to get rid of a van that he owned due to the fact that it was involved in the incident with the boys.

The IVES also stated that they received an anonymous phone call that said that DON and KEVIN had been with another boy, MARK SANDERS and that they had been with the WOOTENS. MARK SANDERS was supposed to have said that KEVIN and DON knew too much and they had to get rid of them. The IVES stated that GAYLA HENRY who is DON HENRY's sister made the statement that she saw the boys at a house off Kirk Road and that Kirk Road is supposed to be where the WOOTENS live.

The IVES stated that a lady reported the gunshots to the Bryant Police Department the night of the incident and that Trooper LAINHART was dispatched to the call about shots being fired, but that he did not make the call due to the fact that the train incident occurred and he went to

assist with the train incident. The IVES stated that the lady who called has a neice named WENDY WALKER.

The IVES stated that a black male identified as CHRIS JONES who goes to school at McClellan and sells drugs was supposed to have in his possession an I.D. card that belonged to KEVIN. A girl named HEATHER, phone number 562-1954, found the I.D. card that belonged to KEVIN in JONES' wallet and when she confronted JONES about it he stated that he had found the I.D. card. The IVES stated that the I.D. card turned out to be KEVIN's Safeway Union I.D. card and that they did not know how JONES came into possession of it and that it was possible that KEVIN might have thrown the I.D. card away.

The IVES stated that on the night of the incident that KEVIN went to TIM MCCAULEY's house, at #78 Aspen, phone number 847-9260, at approximately 11:30 p.m. Information is that KEVIN and TIM talked for approximately ten to fifteen minutes and that KEVIN never went inside the residence. DON HENRY was not with KEVIN at the time that KEVIN met with TIM MCCAULEY. The IVES' family was wondering what DON HENRY was doing during the time that they had separated.

Mrs. IVES stated that she had received information that ROBBIE and CHRIS DAVIS who runs Family Affairs are supposed to be supplying drugs to MARK RUSSELL who works at Family Affairs and who leaks to BILL RUMMELL who was recently charged with promoting male prostitution. Information is that RUSSELL is supposed to be dealing for the DAVIS's and that MARK RUSSELL and KEVIN were friends. Mrs. IVES gave the following list of children who are supposed to be being supplied with drugs from MARK RUSSELL and the DAVIS's.

1. DARREN MURPHY
2. MIKE MITCHELL
3. MIKE MCKIM
4. CREED YOUNG

Mrs. IVES stated that this was just unverified information and that it was hard for her to believe that ROBBIE and CHRIS DAVIS would be involved in narcotics, but thought that it should be mentioned as possible information concerning the death of her son.

The IVES stated that a MATT BLEVINS first made a statement that he was at the arcade in Bryant playing pool with BOBBY JACK SMITH and DON and KEVIN, but later stated that he was not at the arcade playing pool and totally denied ever saying that he was at the arcade with DON and KEVIN. Information

was received that DON HENRY had, had a fight with the owner JOHNNY EVANS.

The IVES stated that a subject identified as KEVIN HINZE who works for Little Rock Water Works came to them and stated that a RICKY BULLOCK and KELLY JACKSON came in to a card game in which Mr. HINZE was involved with on the Saturday night that the boys were killed and asked how to get even or take care of someone who wasn't paying up. One guy at the card table stated "monkey them up and put them on a track." Information is that BULLOCK and JACKSON left and said that they had to take care of business and that HINZE stated that he heard the next day about the boys on the train track and remembered the conversations of BULLOCK and JACKSON and thought that the family should know about the conversation.

The IVES stated that a pastor named Brother BENNIE GRANT of the Indian Springs Baptist Church who has a son that's thirteen to fourteen years old and lives near Mills Park had an incident approximately two weeks ago where the kids were playing and two guys in camouflage clothing and ski mask came out of the woods and grabbed the boy and threw him on the ground and were asking him if he knew where any other boys were. The boy's sister who was with her brother ran and got her mother and as the mother came running and yelling at the boys they took off into the woods. Information was that the next Tuesday after this incident the mother, Ms. GRANT, again saw the two camouflaged individuals along the wood line but when they saw her they ran off. Information was that the GRANT's did not initially report this to the Bryant Police Department, but a late report was made to the Bryant Police Department.

The following will be responses from the IVES concerning investigative lead questions of the Arkansas State Police.

The IVES stated that KEVIN knew BILL RUMMELL who was the subject charged with promoting male prostitution in Bryant recently. The IVES stated that KEVIN knew him through his nephew, BRINCON WILLIAMS who played ball with KEVIN.

The IVES stated that KEVIN had never mentioned a place called the "Blue Note" but that in reference to something like that, if he had known about the location he probably would have not mentioned it to them.

The IVES stated that to their knowledge they did not know a DONNA STEWART and that KEVIN had never mentioned a DONNA STEWART. They also stated that they did not know MARY MAYBERRY and to their knowledge KEVIN did not know MARY MAYBERRY.

The IVES also gave this investigator a copy of their handwritten notes concerning information that they had developed in reference to the death of their son. It was also a copy of the Missouri Pacific railroad form 20018 that was

On Thursday, June 2, 1988 at approximately 7:26 p.m., this investigator contacted DEWAYNE BIGGS by telephone at his home number, 565-1187. Mr. BIGGS related the following in reference to questions about his contact with KEVIN IVES and DON HENRY the night before their deaths.

Mr. BIGGS stated that the last time he saw KEVIN IVES and DON HENRY they were both wearing blue jeans and he thinks that they were possibly Levi's or a similar type. He said that either KEVIN or DON had a muscle type shirt, but he could not remember the color, although he thought it was either yellow or white. He said that he did not notice any clothing which may have been in their vehicle, however he thinks he may have seen a towel, but he was unsure of the color. He stated that neither KEVIN nor DON was wearing a hat or cap and he has never seen either of them wear a hat or cap.

He said that he has never been hunting with KEVIN or DON. He said that either KEVIN or DON said that night that they had seen a deer down by DON's house, but he stated that they also mentioned that they were possibly going rabbit hunting or frog giggering.

Mr. BIGGS said that he does not remember anything being said by either KEVIN or DON in reference to whether they were to meet or contact anyone else that night. He said that when KEVIN and DON left, that DON said he was supposed to go straight home at that time.

Mr. BIGGS stated that in reference to the whiskey bottle that he previously mentioned in an interview, he believes it was KEVIN who showed him the whiskey bottle, but he stated that he did not see the bottle leave their car again before they left.

Ms. RAPER was interviewed at the Arkansas State Hospital in Little Rock by this investigator along with Investigator DON BIRDSONG on June 7, 1988 at 1:05 p.m. Ms. RAPER related as follows.

"I work for the Saline County Hospital Ambulance Service on weekends and sometimes at night during the week. I first started working for the ambulance service in 1979 when I took my first EMT Course. I finished this course in 1980 and I got credited for 120 hours. I also went to school in 1982 and 1984. In September 1984 I passed my Paramedic Schooling and I renewed my licenses in 1986.

The night DON HENRY and KEVIN IVES were run over by a Union Pacific Railroad train we received a call that a train had hit a car. BILLY HEATH was working the ambulance with me that night and he drove the ambulance to the scene. When we arrived at the scene we parked behind some police cars that were parked on a dead-end gravel road that ran down beside the railroad tracks from Highway 111. We did not know at that time that there were two deaths, so we grabbed our paramedic's equipment and took off down the tracks. BILLY reached the first body and he told me to stop and not to come any closer. We then were told that there were two people who had been hit by the train and they both were dead. I just observed the one body and it occurred to me right off that it was strange, because the lack of blood and the color of the body parts and the color of the blood. The color of the body parts had a pale color to them, like someone that had been dead for some time.

I walked back out to where the ambulance was and BILLY stayed at the scene. When I got back to the ambulance there were a lot of people standing around and I asked, 'If anyone knew a closer way I could drive the ambulance in to the scene', and a black man stepped out of the crowd and said he thought he knew a closer way. We got into my ambulance and drove up the highway to a dirt road and he had me to turn down this road. The road

[was real narrow and as we drove in we met a pickup truck coming out. I stopped the ambulance and got out and the black man riding with me walked over to this pickup truck and talked to the people and I walked down to the tracks. When I arrived at the tracks I observed that we were still quite away from this scene, so I walked back out to the ambulance and the pickup truck was gone. The black man and I got back into the ambulance and drove back up to where we had parked when we first arrived. I stayed with the ambulance and did not go back down to the scene. I did not have much conversation with this black man but I do remember he said something about he was a fireman or use to be a fireman.

This is the first time that I have been on a train wreck since I have been working for the ambulance."
