"I was at the Blue Note in Alexander the hight the two boys were ran over by the train. I first heard bout it the next day on Channel 11 TV Station during the news.

That night I was at the Blue Note for about thirty (30) or fourty-five (45) minutes. I stayed outside except when twent inside one time to use the bathroom. I don't remember what time it was when I was there. While I was there I did not see any white boys there, in fact I have never seen any white boys there at the Blue Note when I have been there."

On June 22, 1988, this investigator contacted Captain RAY RICHMOND of the Saline County Sheriff's Department and received from him two packages containing a green vegetable matter that has been identified as being marijuana.

After receiving this marijuana from Captain RICHMOND this investigator hand delivered it to the Arkansas State Police Headquarters where it has been shipped to Dr. JOSEPH BURTON in Decatur, Georgia.

Ms. MCKENZIE was interviewed by this investigator at her residence on June 22, 1988, at 11:15 a.m., and she related as follows.

"Yes, my son, RONNIE GODWIN is in the Jefferson County jail at Pine Bluff for violating his probation.

No, my son never said anything to me about seeing two policemen rough up two boys at the RANCHETTE Grocery Store in Alexander the night the two boys were ran over by the train.

If my son was drinking that night then there is no telling what he told that he saw. If he has been drinking then you can't believe a word he has to say."

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# INVESTIGATOR'S NOTES

During the interview of RONNIE GODWIN conducted on June 20, 1988, I obtained information from him that would establish the date and time which he alleges to have seen an incident at Highway 111 and Shobe Road.

GODWIN reported that the incident occurred while he was taking time off from his employment for Trac-Work Incorporated of Little Rock. He said the incident occurred after his arrival home from Lone and Star Air Force Base in Texarkana and his departure to Batesville where he worked at the Kodak Plant.

On June 21, 1988, I contacted BETTY WARD, Payroll officer for Trac-Work Incorporated, 7700 Jamison Road, Little Rock, Arkansas, phone #568-4144.

Ms. WARD gave me the following information.

For the week ending August 18, 192, GODWIN worked at COPPERS Company in North Little Rock. He worked thirty-two (32) hours that week.

For the week ending August 22, 1987, GODWIN worked eight hours at COPPERS in North Little Rock.

For the week ending August 29, 1987, GODWIN worked at COPPERS Company in North Little Rock for  $43\frac{1}{2}$  hours and three hours overtime at another assignment in El Dorado.

For the week ending September 5, 1987, GODWIN worked 40 hours at the Lone Star Military Base in Texarkana.

The week ending September 12, 1987, he was still working at Texarkana.

On the week ending September 19, 1987, GODWIN put in another full week at the Lone Star Military Base in Texarkana.

On the week ending September 26, 1987, GODWIN worked at Texarkana and ended the week with eleven hours on Saturday, September 26, at Eastern Kodak in Batesville, Arkansas.

According to GODWIN the incident occurred in the interim between his

On June 20, 1988 beginning at 2:43 p.m,. I interviewed RONNIE GODWIN at the Jefferson County Jail.

GODWIN is incarcerated for probation violation.

The probation was a result of a breaking and entering charge from Jefferson Gounts.

GODWIN gave me the following information concerning what an anonymous caller reported to the State Police as information concerning the deaths of "two (2) boys on the railroad track at Benton".

GODWIN gave me the following information.

He had been at Gigi's Nightclub located at Highway 5 and the Saline/Pulaski County line. The day he recalls is either August 22 or 23, 1987.

GODWIN left Gigi's and was travelling home, driving south on Highway 111, when he saw two (2) men he believed to be police officers, two (2) teenaged boys, and what he believed to be an unmarked police car parked in the parking lot of Miller's Grocery. He estimated the time at approximately 2:30 a.m.

He described the vehicle as a grey, plain car. He said the car had police hubcaps, three (3) antennas on the trunk, and a spotlight on the side.

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One of the men described as the larger of the two and dressed in a white pullover shirt and blue jeans was seen pushing a teenaged white male against a phone booth. Another teenager was kneeling on the ground between the phone booth and the police car. A second man, GODWIN believed to be a police officer also was standing over the teenage boy kneeling on the ground.


GODWIN proceeded south on Highway 111, pasted Shobe Road and pulled into a trailer lot just south of the Miller's Grocery parking lot.

GODWIN watched as the man in the white shirt pushed the boy against the phone booth several times and then both men loaded the two boys into the back seat of the car. The car crossed Highway 111 and proceeded east on Shobe Road.

GODWIN said the car went up the road and apparently did not turn off until it went over the crest of a hill

GODWIN said the car came back approximately five or ten minutes later, crossed Highway 111 and proceeded west on Shobe Road. He said as the car passed he noticed a bag, he believed to be a garbage bag, in the back seat of the car.

GODWIN provided information by drawing a map which detailed the location of his vehicle and the relative location of the grocery store and phone booth. A compilation of the information will be provided on a diagram attached to this report.

public service with Mr. HINZE at This interview was conducted via his parents' residence, commencing at 6:36 p.m. on June 22, 1988 by Investigator DAVE DILLINGER. During this interview, Mr. HINZE was somewhat reluctant to talk to this investigator; however, he stated that he was not at the card came, but heard about the conversation at the game from a third party. Mr. a INZE would not divulge the name of the individual from whom he received the information over the phone and an appointment was made to meet him on the next day.

This interview was conducted at Mr. HINZE's place of employment, Little Rock Waste Water Utility, commencing at 9:55 a.m. on June 23, 1988 by Investigator DAVE DILLINGER. No one else was present during this interview.

During this interview, Mr. HINZE stated that he heard of the card game and the conversation regarding placing someone on the railroad tracks from WILLIAM HOYCE GILMORE. He stated that GILMORE had told his wife while HINZE's wife was present. HINZE's wife later related the conversation to him and he went to GILMORE's house to ask him about it. HINZE stated that GILMORE told him that he was at a card game the week before HENRY and IVES were killed, possibly the Friday night before. HINZE related that GILMORE told him that RICKY BULLOCK and KELLY JACKSON were at the card game and had asked what to do to someone who would not pay a debt or welched on a deal. Allegedly someone at the game told of an incident in Chicago where the victim was shot and placed on a railroad track in an attempt to hide the crime. Upon hearing this, BULLOCK and JACKSON left the card game, stating they had some business to attend to.

HINZE stated that he knew both RICKY BULLOCK and KELLY JACKSON and

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have known them for sometime. He stated that JACKSON used to sell marijuana but he had heard JACKSON had stopped approximately two years ago. HINZE described BULLOCK as "Crazy". He stated that BULLOCK's family has quite a bit of money and that BULLOCK had been in trouble on several occasions. HINZE stated that he had heard that BULLOCK obtained several counterfeit \$100.00 bills at one time and had used small children to pass them at various stores by buying an item and bringing him the change. HINZE stated that he could not confirm this.

HINZE also stated that WILLIAM HORACE (BILL) GILMORE lived at #2 Centark Circle off of old Stagecoath Road.

This interview was concluded at 10:15 a.m.

The trailer mentioned in WILLIAM GILMORE's interview was located at 10221 Lanehart Road. The trailer is rented by SUE LESLIE, same address. She stated that it is rented to a DALE BOWMAN and a JEFF LNU and they have lived there for at least two years.

This interview was conducted at the office of Pleasant Valley Pointe Apartments in Little Rock, Arkansas, commencing at 9:25 on June 23, 1988, by Investigator DAVE DILLINGE. No else was present during this interview.

During this interview, Mr. TRERO stated that he had heard from a KEITH LNU that HENRY and IVES were killed because they had "snitched off" someone on a drug deal. TRE stated that KEITH had gotten the information from his brother BRIAN LNU, who was friends with one of the victims. TRERO stated that he had met KEITH when they were both doing maintenance at Brentwood Apartments on Baseline Road. He stated he believed that KEITH and BRIAN had moved to the West Memphis area shortly after the deaths of HENRY and IVES. Allegedly they were afraid of something or someone. TRERO stated that the manager of Brentwood Apartments at the time, KITTY GALLAGHER, would probably know KEITH's last name, possibly have some more information on him. He stated that he would see Ms. GALLAGHER this afternoon and would ask her to call.

This interview was concluded at 9:45 a.m.

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# INVESTIGATOR'S NOTES

On June 23, 1988, this investigator checked with the manager of Brentwood Apartments on Baseline Road in Little Rock concerning KEITH LNU, a former maintenance man. The manager stated that they had no personnel records over a few months old as the apartments had changed hands at that time. One of the maintenance people at the apartments stated that he had known KEITH a little bit because KEITH was head of maintenance at Brentwood when he came. However he stated, he had heard that KEITH had moved to Memphis approximately one year ago. This investigator left a business card at Brentwood Apartments and the manager stated that she would call if any information developed on KEITH.

RONNIE did not tell me that he had-seen some boys getting roughed up by two police officers there by the RANCHETTE Grocery Store. In fact he has never told me about seeing any boys getting roughed up by the police anywhere.

What his mother told you about him making up stories when he gets drunk is true. When he gets drunk you don't know what to expect out of him."

Ms. HARRISON was interviewed telephonically by this investigator on June 23, 1988 at 10:20 a.m., and she related as follows.

"RONNIE GODWIN is my brother. | RONNIE lives with his girlfriend, PAT COLLINS in Alexander. RONNIE is my brother and I love him to death, but when he gets drunk you can't believe a word he says.

What you just told me that RONNIE told wou is not true. He never said anything to me about seeing some bys being roughed up by two police officers at the grocery store in anncheste. If he had of told me that I probably would not have believed him, because you can't believe what he says when he is drinking. If he said he saw some boys being roughed up when he was drinking then I would not believe one word of it."

This interview was conducted at Mr. GILMORE's residence, commencing at 10:48 a.m., on June 23, 1988, by Investigator DAVE DILLINGER. No one else was present during this interview.

During this interview, Mr. GISMORE stated that he was at a card game at a trailer on Lanehart Road in Little Rock on the Friday night before HENRY and IVES were killed. He stated that he remembered the date because on the next night, he was arrested for DWI by Trooper LAINHART of the Arkansas State Police Mr GILMORE stated that he did not know anyone at the card game except STEVE PERMENTER, with whom he went to the trailer. He stated that he did recognize RICKY BULLOCK and KELLY JACKSON among the twenty (20) to thirty (30) people who were at the trialer at various times during the night. He stated he did not know to whom the trailer belonged. Concerning the comment about placing someone on a railroad track, Mr. GILMORE stated that BULLOCK and JACKSON had asked someoneat the trailer what to do with someone who would not pay a debt. However the comment made about "monkeying someone up and placing them on the railroad track" was made some two hours after BULLOCK and JACKSON left the trailer. GILMORE stated that they left the trailer at approximately 7:00 or 8:00 p.m. and the railroad track comment was made approximately 10:00 p.m. by someone he didn't know. GILMORE stated that he left the trailer at approximately 10:30 that evening. GILMORE further stated that he did not know how the topic came up about putting someone on the railroad track but, in any event, the comment was made long after BULLOCK and JACKSON left the trailer.

GILMORE described the trailer as being behind a red house on the right on Lanehart road.

She said that he said he had asked his name not to be used when he had given the information, but it had mistakenly been given to us in the IVES' note.

HINZE told her that his wife and baby lived out in the country and if the Sheriff's Office found out he was talking he feared for their lives.

I contacted Investigator DILLINGER who interviewed him with reference to some information about remarks at a card game the day before the incident occurred. Investigator DILLINGER advised me that HINZE had not heard those remarks but it came second hand and he had interviewed that subject (GILMORE) also, but the facts weren't as they had been represented to us.

Ms. OLSON was interviewed at her residence on June 24, 1988, at 11:15 a.m. by this investigator along with Investigator RICHARD CARMAN and Investigator TIM RILES of the Saline County Sheriff's Office and Ms. OLSON related as follows.

"I met a man by the name of THOMAS SMITH, and he started coming by my house to visit and he would do some work for me. On April 3, 1988, he came by and was going to work on my car. I had left my purse in my car and he was outside working on my car when he drove it off and I have not seen him or my car since. I turned in a report to the Saline County Sheriff's Department as being stolen.

About three or four days before he stole my car, THOMAS SMITH told me that he had been in the Saline County jail for stealing some boats, when he heard that two Saline County Deputies had killed the two boys and placed them on the railroad tracks. He stated that the two deputies were having sex with a fourteen (14) year old black girl and the two young boys walked up them, so the two deputies killed them so they wouldn't talk."

Our members do not have to sign the book when they come in except when they have a guest with them and their guest has to sign also. I do not know where my books are for August 1987. I may have already destroyed them. RONNI hardly ever comes in here on a Sunday night. He is always in here of Saturday night, but not on Sundays."

Ms. PETERS was interviewed at the Saline County Prosecuting Attorney's Office in Benton on June 21, 1988, at 2:00 p.m., by this investigator along with Deputy Prosecuting Attorney DAN HARMON and Investigator RICHARD CARMAN of the Saline County Sheriff's Department and Ms. PETERS related that the night the two boys were ran over by the train, there was a party upon Alexander Mountain. She stated that there were six or seven cars that drove by her house going upon the mountain. She stated that she got drunk at her house and passed out and she heard later that the police went up there and proke up the party.

In regards to being questioned about the Blue Note, a club in Alexander, she stated that she has seen white boys at the club before. She stated that she did not know the two boys who were killed on the railroad tracks, but that she had seen their pictures on T. V. and in the newspapers, but she had never seen them in the Blue Note. The owner of the Blue Note is a DOYLE TYSON and he use to sell marijuana before he got busted by the Pulaski County Sheriff's Department.

In regards to a subject called J. D. that is from Chicago, Ms. PETERS stated that his real name is JAMES DEAN MURRY, a black male, about 6'1", and 200 pounds. She stated that she first met J. D. about eight years ago and he would give her cocaine and she would have sex with him in return.

In regards to a RONNIE ROBINSON, a white male, who lives in Salem Community in Saline County, she stated that she met him in October of last year and she started dating him on his days off from work. She stated that he would come by her house, but they would not do anything in her place. She stated she would go to his house and spend the weekend there with him. He would provide her with cocaine and \$200.00 each weekend and she would have sex with him in return.

In regards to initials L. D. FARMER she stated that she has known him all her life. She stated that she had been meeting L. D. and going over to a house with a brick wall around it bff of Sardis Road by Shannon Hills. She stated that she never went inside the house. She just stayed outside in a motor home with L. D., that was parked at the house. She stated she never did see anyone else at the house, and L. D. had a key and would unlock the front gates so they could get inside.

Ms. PETERS also stated that she use to date a white Pulaski County Deputy by the name RICK ECHOLS, who was fired because of her.
